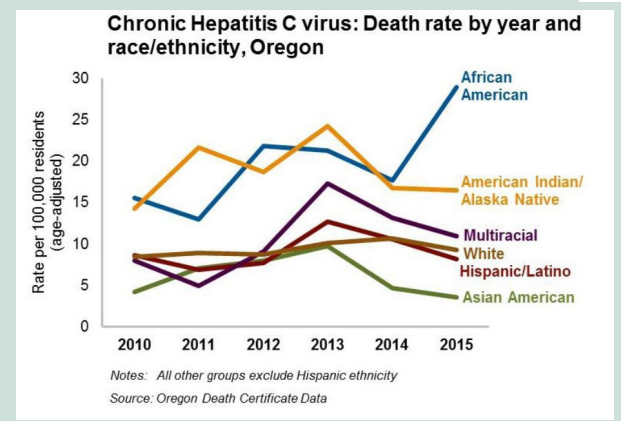
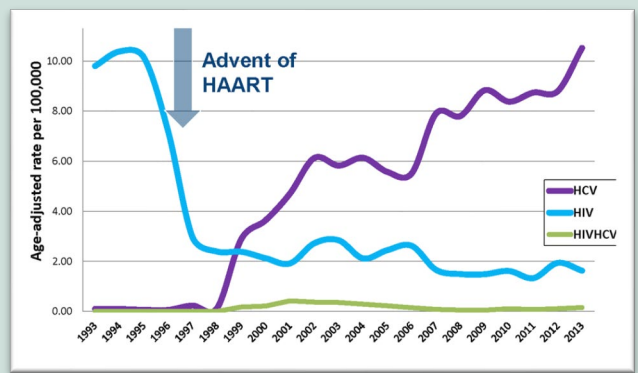


Making Hepatitis History

ON THE ROAD TO ELIMINATION IN OREGON

- 1998**: HCV deaths surpass HIV in Oregon
- 2000**: CDC funding for study of causes of chronic liver disease in Multnomah County (Ann Thomas, MD)
- 2003**: CDC funding for Adult Viral Hepatitis Prevention Coordinator (AVHPC)
- 2005**: Positive lab results for HCV made reportable
- 2006**: First strategic plan for controlling HCV in Oregon
- 2011**: FDA approves first direct-acting antiviral agent for HCV
- 2015**: First Oregon Viral Hepatitis Report. Oregon has the highest Hepatitis C mortality rate and the 3rd highest Hepatitis C prevalence rate in the nation
- 2016**: Formation of the Oregon Viral Hepatitis Collective (OVHC)
- 2017**: OHSU receives funding for OR-HOPE study, piloting use of peer recovery specialists to offer HCV testing and treatment to PWIDs
- 2018**: OHP expanded HCV DAA treatment to individuals with fibrosis score ≥ 2
- 2019**: OHP drops restriction for individuals with SUD/AUD and PWID, expands coverage to F0
- 2020**: Launch of PRIME+ program modeled after OR-HOPE
- 2021**: CDC funds both AVHPC and Epidemiologist
- 2023**: OHP drops all HCV DAA treatment prior authorization requirements
- 2024**: Oregon Viral Hepatitis Elimination Plan released by OHA
